PRAYER OF CONFESSION:

L: This Sunday is Reign of Christ Sunday; it is also the Sunday before Thanksgiving. That being said, too often we fail to turn to God for guidance, wisdom, strength and courage for the living of our days. We also often fail to live with a sense of gratitude for God's presence and blessing in our lives. In doing so we fall short of being the people and creation God created us to be. Let us now pause for a moment of silent confession and reflection.

Moment of Silent Confession and Reflection

L: O God we beseech you

All: *For all the ill that we have done and all the good we have left undone;
For our failure to remember to give thanks to you and to others –
have mercy on us.*

ASSURANCE OF PARDON:

L: A cord of love binds us to God. For God so loved the world that God sent Jesus into the world not to condemn but in order that the world might be saved through Christ. God accepts us as we are but doesn't leave us unchanged when we turn to God. Trust and believe that God forgives our sin and through the power of the Holy Spirit, enables us to recommit ourselves to live into all that God created us to be.

All: *We will trust and believe that we are forgiven and saved by God's love for us. Thanks be to God.*

¹ O come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation!

Instructions concerning Prayer

² First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, ² for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity. ³ This is right and is acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, ⁴ who desires everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. ⁵ For

there is one God; there is also one mediator between God and humankind,

Christ Jesus, himself human,

⁶ who gave himself a ransom for all

—this was attested at the right time. ⁷ For this I was appointed a herald and an apostle (I am telling the truth, I am not lying), a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth.

A TIME OF REFLECTION and PRAYER:

Supplications, Prayers, Intercessions, and Thanksgivings

Psalm 95:1-7, **1 Timothy 2:1-7**

I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, ² for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity. Instead of me doing a reflection on this scripture I am going to ask that we heed this scripture and do what it says. Let us enter into an extended time of prayer and in doing so may we come to know better our need for God and our interconnectedness with God, with one another, and with creation and gain an understanding of who and whose we are.

As we enter into this time of prayer may we remember Jesus' words from his Sermon on the Mount which says *"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' ⁴⁴ But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, ⁴⁵ so that you may be children of your Father in heaven; for he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the righteous and on the unrighteous."*

Through out our time of prayer there will be many times for each of you to share your supplications, intercessions and thanksgivings as well. When we pause for reflection for self and others you may do so silently or speak those supplications and prayers aloud. So let us pray!

O God, Eternal Spirit, we thank you that you have called us into relationship with you, one another and all of creation and that you give us a purpose in life, a mission to fulfill. Though at times we only dimly see what that mission is, we thank you that one day we will see in full. Until that day comes, help us to cling to our identity in you as a beloved part of your divine creation and called to walk in the ways of Christ empowered by your Holy Spirit. Distribute among us and all people - gifts of prophecy and discernment, love and hope that all may turn to you and in that each of us may discern our purpose, individually and collectively and live into the fulfillment of who you created each of us to be.

We pray for the leaders of this nation and all nations that they may be guided by your divine will so all may live in peace and live life to the fullest.

Because our vision is still yet dim, we admit that we are merely wayfarers in this world and often prone to erratic changes of course. We thank you God that no matter how far off course we travel, you are there to guide and redirect us to your life-giving ways if we only have eyes to see and ears to hear. We pray for all who know they are lost and have gone astray, may your Spirit sustain, encourage and enable them to find their worth and sense of purpose in you once again, or even for the first time in their lives.

(Pause for Reflection for self and others)

We also pray for the ways all have gone astray in different ways, but are too blind to see the errors of those ways, may you grant eyes to see, ears to hear and a willing spirit to change those ways.

(Pause for reflection for self and others)

As we enter this festive season of Thanksgiving, Advent, Christmas, and a New Year, where we celebrate the bounty of harvest, gather with family and friends and celebrate the coming of your light into the darkness, may we remember there are many who go without food, shelter, or necessary clothing and so we lift them in prayer. God, you know their needs, both immediate and the underlying causes and we entrust these needs into your care. For where you are asking us to be the vessels through whom you will supply those needs, help us to respond with a here I am Lord, may it be as you have said.

(Pause for Reflection)

In this time where we celebrate the harvest of bounty help us to appreciate those who made it possible for us to live and celebrate the bounty that is before us because of

- those who plant, and tend, and harvest the crops
- those who buck the seas in harvesting fish
- those who raise cattle, pigs and sheep
- those who process the harvest
- those who transport and stock and sell the harvest
- those who make the machinery and equipment necessary for all of this

Help us to understand and embrace our interconnectedness; as we do may we better live with a sense of gratitude and appreciation for the sacrifices others make for us and we make for others so that all may have life and life to the fullest.

Though this should be a joyous time of year, there are many who weep and sink into the depths of despair for various reasons whether it be mental health stressors, missing loved ones who have died or moved away, broken relationships, loss of stability in one's life from various circumstances to name just a few and so we pray for those who weep and for those who have caused others to weep. We thank you that you are a God of compassion and that you watch the ways of all of us and weave out of terrible happenings wonders of goodness and grace. Surround those who have been shaken by tragedy with a sense of your very present love, and hold them in faith. We especially pray for

(Pause for reflection and names and circumstances)

Though they are lost in grief, may they be comforted. Where you are calling us to be your vessels of comfort may we respond with Here I am Lord, may it be as you have said. We also pray for those who bring harm to others that those harmful ways may be rooted out of those lives and may that void be filled with your compassion and generosity.

We thank you that you are a God of healing and realize that often times your healing comes through human hands and so we thank you for those who bring healing to the sick in so many different ways. May you pour out your blessings upon them and grant them wisdom and compassion as they seek to be your vessels of healing in this world. At this time, we especially lift up those who bring healing to others and those who are in need of healing. (Pause for names)

O God, we thank you that you have bound us together in a common life. Help us to remember our interconnectedness and the impact our individual lives have on one another and creation and have an appreciation for that. When struggles and conflicts arise help us as individuals and nations to confront one another without hatred and bitterness and to work together to attack the problem with mutual patience and respect in order to bring about a resolution for the good of the whole creation.

God. At this time, we lift up to you any other joys, concerns and thanks that we may have

Almighty and most gracious God, whose very nature is to be present

- in good times and bad
- in warm days and in cold
- in wind, rain and sunny life
- in laughter and in pain
- in joy and in despair
- in work and in play

open our minds and hearts to the realities of the present here and now and your presence with us. Help us hold on to the assurance of your companionship and the knowledge of your loving care so that we may be strengthened by our hope in you and shaped by your love as we pray, embrace and live the words Jesus taught us to pray.
